SUPPLEMENTARY DEED OF AGREEMENT

KINGSWAY SCHOOL,

THIS DEED OF AGREEMENT is made on the 15th day of December Two Thousand (2000) BETWEEN **THE KINGSWAY TRUST** a charitable trust incorporated under the Charitable Trusts Act 1957 (hereinafter with its successors referred to as "the Proprietor") of the first part and **HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN** acting by and through the Minister of Education (hereinafter referred to as "The Minister") of the second part.

WHEREAS

- A By Deed of Agreement bearing date the 5th day of November 1998 as varied by any subsequent supplementary agreements (hereinafter referred to as "the Deed of Agreement"), the Minister and the Proprietor pursuant to section 7(2) of the Private Schools Conditional Integration Act 1975 established **KingsWay School** as an integrated school (hereinafter referred to as "the School").
- B The Proprietor and the Minister are now agreed on the need to amend Clause 8 of the Deed of Agreement pursuant to section 7(9) of the Private Schools Conditional Integration Act 1975.

NOW THIS DEED OF AGREEMENT WITNESSETH THAT IT IS HEREBY COVENANTED AGREED AND DECLARED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO AS FOLLOWS:

- **THAT** the words "Four hundred (400) pupils" in the 5th line in clause 19 of the Deed of Agreement be deleted from that Agreement and the words "Five hundred and twenty (520) pupils" be substituted therefore.
- **THAT** the covenants conditions and restrictions contained and implied in the Deed of Agreement shall be read and construed subject to the modifications herein contained but in all other respects the Deed of Agreement is confirmed.
