

SUPPLEMENTARY DEED OF AGREEMENT

MAHURANGI CHRISTIAN SCHOOL

THIS DEED OF AGREEMENT is made on the Third day of February one thousand nine hundred and ninety-nine (1999) BETWEEN THE MAHURANGI BAPTIST CHARITABLE TRUST a "Corporation Sole" (hereinafter with his successors referred to as "the Proprietor) of the first part and HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN acting by and through the Minister of Education (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") as the second part.

WHEREAS

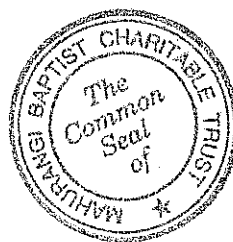
- A By deed of Agreement bearing date the 31st day of October 1995 as varied by any subsequent supplementary agreements (hereinafter referred to as "the Deed of Agreement"), the Minister and the Proprietor pursuant to section 7(2) of the Private Schools Conditional Integration Act 1975 established Mahurangi Christian School, Warkworth as an integrated school (hereinafter referred to as "the School").
- B The Proprietor and the Minister are now agreed on the need to amend Clause 20 of the Deed of Agreement pursuant to section 7(9) of the Private Schools Conditional Integration Act 1975.

NOW THIS DEED OF AGREEMENT WITNESSETH THAT IT IS HEREBY COVENANTED AGREED AND DECLARED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. THAT the number "50" in the 4th line in clause 20 of the Deed of Agreement be deleted from that Agreement and the number "84" be substituted therefor
- 2. THAT the covenants conditions and restrictions contained and implied in the Deed of Agreement shall be read and construed subject to the modifications herein contained but in all other respects the Deed of Agreement is confirmed.
