

SUPPLEMENTARY DEED OF AGREEMENT

ST JOSEPH'S SCHOOL, FEILDING

THIS DEED OF AGREEMENT is made on the 6th day of April One Thousand nine hundred and eighty nine (1989) BETWEEN THE ROMAN CATHOLIC BISHOP OF THE DIOCESE OF PALMERSTON NORTH a "Corporation Sole" (hereinafter with his successors referred to as "the Proprietor") of the first part and HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN acting by and through the Minister of Education (hereinafter referred to as "The Minister") of the second part

WHEREAS

- A By Deed of Agreement bearing date the 27th day of January 1983 as varied by any subsequent supplementary agreements (hereinafter referred to as "the Deed of Agreement"), the Minister and the Proprietor pursuant to section 7(2) of the Private Schools Conditional Integration Act 1975 established St Joseph's School, Feilding as an integrated school (hereinafter referred to as "the school").
- B The Proprietor and the Minister are now agreed on the need to amend Clause 8, Clause 10(b), the Third Schedule to the Deed of Agreement and to add a Fifth Schedule and Clause 8A and Clause 13A to the Deed of Agreement for the school pursuant to the Private Schools Conditional Integration Act 1975.

NOW THIS DEED OF AGREEMENT WITNESSETH THAT IT IS HEREBY COVENANTED AGREED AND DECLARED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO AS FOLLOWS:

1. THAT the words "One hundred and eighty-five (185)" in Clause 8 of the Deed of Agreement be deleted from that Agreement and the words "One hundred and ninety-nine (199) of whom no more than fourteen (14) shall be enrolled in the attached unit for hearing impaired pupils" be substituted therefor.

2. THAT the words "...nine (9) pupils out of the total roll of the School" in line 8 of Clause 10(b) be deleted and the words "twenty-three (23) pupils of whom not more than fourteen (14) shall be enrolled in the attached unit for hearing impaired pupils and not more than nine (9) shall be enrolled in the rest of the school" shall be substituted therefor.
3. THAT the Agreement be further amended by inserting the following clause after Clause 8:
"8A ENROLMENT in the School's unit for hearing impaired pupils will be on the recommendation of the Director-General of Education and the Controlling Authority provided the Proprietor agrees and places are available."
4. THAT the Agreement be further amended by inserting the following clause after Clause 13:
"13A IT is agreed by and between the parties hereto that the School shall be staffed as for a state school with comparable pupils."
5. THAT the Third Schedule to the Agreement is hereby amended by adding under the heading "BUILDING REQUIREMENTS" the words "provide by new construction or remodelling the following: teaching space totalling 130 m²".
6. THAT the Agreement be further amended by adding a Fifth Schedule as follows:

FIFTH SCHEDULE

Resume of the historical and traditional connections between St Dominic's School for Deaf Children and St Joseph's School Feilding.



St Joseph's School Feilding was originally established in 1906 with a gift from Mrs W. Johnson of Highden in memory of her late husband. It was originally staffed by members of the Roman Catholic religious congregation known as the Sisters of St Joseph of Nazareth. The congregation withdrew from the teaching staff in 1986. The school continues to operate with the ideals characteristic of that congregation, which ideals include

- . a spirit of community within the school
- . an atmosphere of simplicity and sincerity
- . dedication to the service of others especially the poor
- . fostering a free faith commitment to Christ and His values
- . encouraging pupils to develop their potential
- . relating education to the circumstances in which the pupils will live.

In 1989 a unit for hearing impaired pupils was established as an integral part of St Joseph's School. This unit, known as "the St Dominic's unit" was established as a replacement for St Dominic's School for the Deaf, closed in 1989.

St Dominic's School for the Deaf was originally established in 1944 in Dover Street, Wellington and moved to Feilding in 1953. From that time it enjoyed the support of the people of Feilding.

Until 1989, St Dominic's School was conducted by the Roman Catholic religious congregation known as the New Zealand Dominican Sisters.

The establishment of St Dominic's unit as part of St Joseph's School brings to the ideals of St Joseph's as additional enrichment, the spirit traditional in the educational establishments of the Dominican Order and which previously distinguished St Dominic's School for the Deaf including

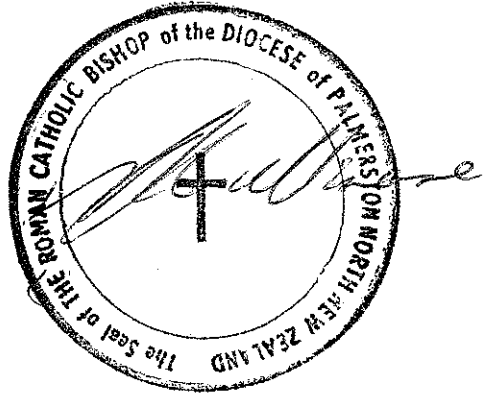
- . a recognition of the gifts and talents of all pupils
- . an emphasis on logical, honest and increasingly independent thought based on TRUTH
- . a fostering of an appreciation of the cultural heritage of the past and the understanding and acceptance of the highest moral and human values
- . pastoral care for the less fortunate in society.

This resume shall not be construed as adding to or amending the Special Character of the school as defined in Clause 5 of this Agreement.

7. THAT the covenants conditions and restrictions contained and implied in the Deed of Agreement shall be read and construed subject to the modifications herein contained but in all other respects the Deed of Agreement is confirmed.
8. THIS agreement will come into effect on 18 April 1989.
