SUPPLEMENTARY DEED OF AGREEMENT

ST MARY'S SCHOOL, CARTERTON

THIS DEED OF AGREEMENT is made on the One thousand nine hundred and ninety-eight (1998) BETWEEN THE ROMAN CATHOLIC ARCHBISHOP OF THE ARCHDIOCESE OF WELLINGTON a "Corporation Sole" (hereinafter with his successors referred to as "the Proprietor") of the first part and HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN acting by and through the Minister of Education (hereinafter referred to as "The Minister") of the second part.

WHEREAS

- A By Deed of Agreement bearing date the 10th day of February 1983 as varied by any subsequent supplementary agreements (hereinafter referred to as "the Deed of Agreement"), the Minister and the Proprietor pursuant to section 7(2) of the Private Schools Conditional Integration Act 1975 established **St Mary's**School, Carterton as an integrated school (hereinafter referred to as "the School").
- B Pursuant to section 7(9) of the Act, the Proprietor and the Minister are now agreed to change the percentage of non-preference pupils in attendance at the school as specified in clause 10(b) of the Deed of Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. THE Deed of Agreement is hereby amended by:
 - (a) Omitting from Clause 10(b) the words "shall be limited at all times to five (5) per cent," and
 - (b) Substituting the words "shall be limited at all times to ten (10) per cent".
- 2. THAT the covenants, conditions and restrictions contained and implied in the Deed of Agreement shall be read together with Clause 1 of this Supplementary Deed of Agreement but in all other respects the Deed of Agreement is confirmed.
